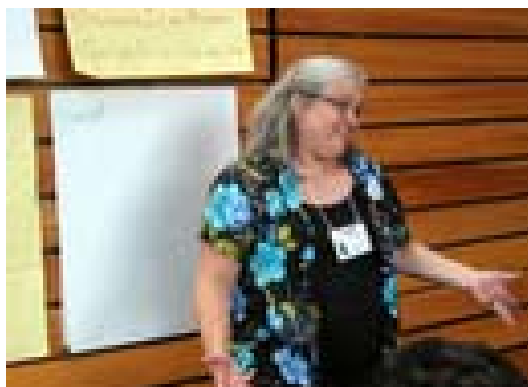

Meet IN-NELL 2008 Teacher of the Year: Janet Holzer



Janet is a master teacher with over thirty years of teaching experience in German and French and currently teaches French at Eastwood Middle School in Washington Township.

Janet has been a major part of the action regarding World Language education in the state of Indiana. She has played a vital role in the formation and editing of state standards and proficiency guidelines.

Janet has contributed much to World Language organizations in the state and nation. She has helped to organize and contribute to the State German Contest from 1992-2002, receiving the Judy Eaton Spirit Award for her work in the German contest even while her only teaching assignment was French. As if that weren't enough, she acted as Secretary for the American Association of Teachers of French in Indiana and has been on the board for the State French Contest since the mid-1990s and still serves today. In addition, she has served as Secretary and Parliamentarian for the Indiana Foreign Language Teachers' Association and is a regular presenter of sessions and workshops. She served as the Student Marshals Chair at both the IFLTA Conference and the Central States Conference on the Teaching of Foreign Languages. Just recently, Janet was a coach under Susan Gross at the 2008 National TPRS Conference. In addition to the Judy Eaton Spirit Award and IN-NELL 2008 Teacher of the Year, Janet was awarded the 1997 Pre-Collegiate Teacher of the Year by the Indiana Association of Teachers of German and the 2004 grades K-8 Teacher of the Year by the Indiana chapter of the American Association of Teachers of French.

Janet is married with three grown children and enjoys, in her own words, "reading, writing, playing silly games on the computer, avoiding grading, attending musical theatre when I can afford it". Janet is a witty, talented, and dedicated teacher who loves her students and teaching. She is truly deserving to be IN-NELL's 2008 Teacher of the Year.

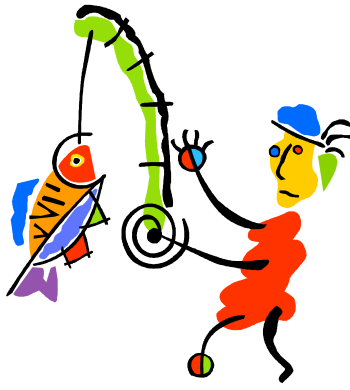
IN-NELL Teaching Tip

Need an idea for a quick presentation?

Suggested grade levels: 3-4

Read to students the book Look What Came From Mexico by Miles Harvey. It shows a variety of items in our everyday lives that originated in Mexico, including foods, clothing, animals, games, and words in our language. Many of us have realia that can be used in a brief presentation by students for a class or for parents. This has been a successful presentation by our third graders at assemblies. One of the good things about it is that every child can be involved.



Fishing for some new teaching ideas?

Materials needed: Gold Fish Crackers
Colored Dice
Record Sheet (see attached)
Boats (see attached)

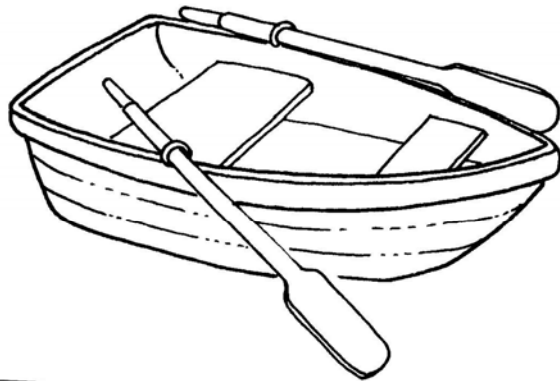
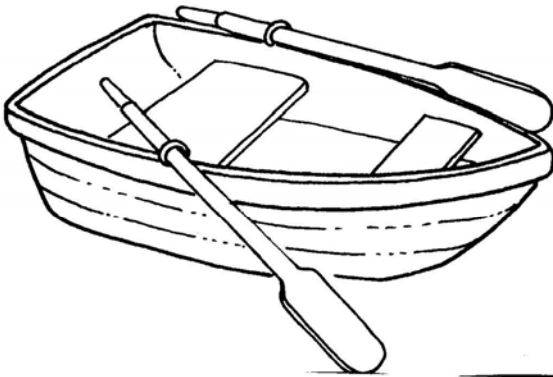
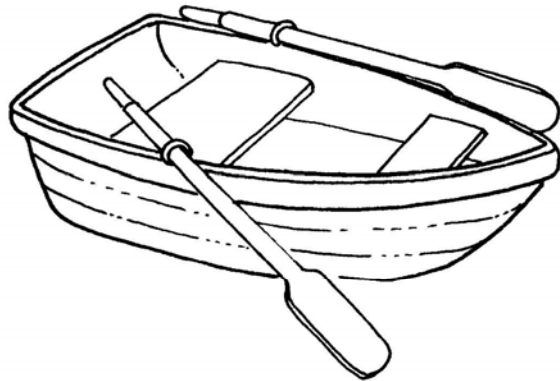
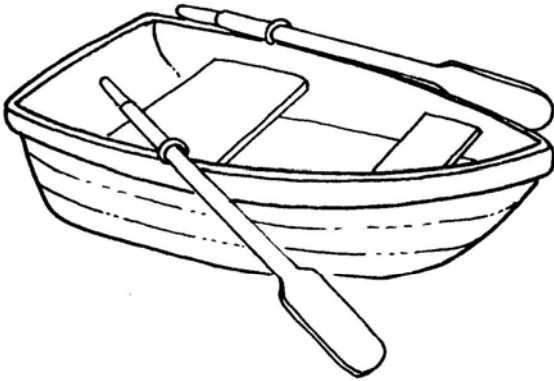
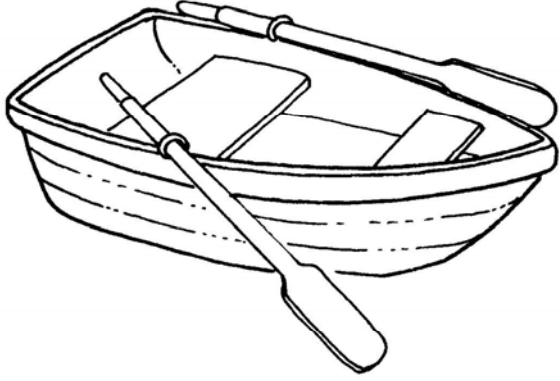
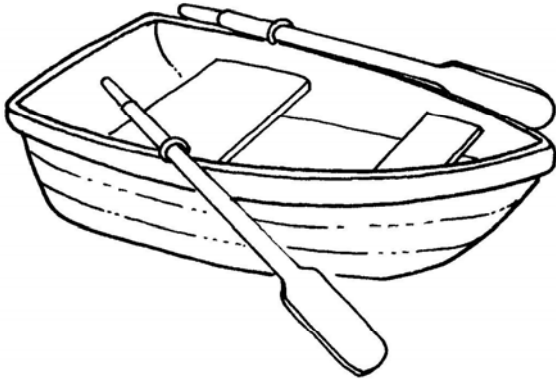
This is a terrific activity to practice counting and using numbers in the target language. This can be tailored for any language and something ALL students enjoy because it includes a snack!

Break students into small groups. Give students some gold fish crackers as a snack. The group will also need a pile of gold fish to play their game. One color of dice will represent the number of boats. The second die will represent the number of fish on the boats.

If you play in groups of 3 or 4, students can take turns (clockwise). The first student will roll the die for the number of boats. Once the number has been rolled he/she will ask the next student in the target language "How many boats are there"? The student will answer with the correct number in the target language, put the boats in the center of the desks and then record it on the chart. Moving on to the next person, he/she will roll the dice and ask the next person in the target language, "How many fish are there"? The student will answer in the target language, put the appropriate number of fish on the boats, and then record it on the chart.

The last student will have to answer the question, "How many total fish are there". Once he/she answers and records it on the chart, the group will repeat the steps again. When the chart is filled, the students are done! For lower elementary, this is a great activity to practice counting, adding, and multiplying.

I attached some materials (see pages 5 & 6), that you may find useful when creating this activity. Have fun!

IN-NELL Teaching Tip: A Quick Filler—Tracing

Suggested grade levels: 1-3

The class is divided into two teams. The teacher has a stack of cards with a letter (or number, or shape) on each. Students take turns from each team coming to the front with their back toward the class. The teacher chooses a card, shows the rest of the class, and traces the letter on the child's back. If they answer what it is correctly, they gain a point for their team.

Be a full time elementary teacher, or a teacher of beginning language in middle or high school.

Demonstrate evidence of excellence and innovation in their teaching practices.

Demonstrate interest in promoting language study by their active involvement in professional organizations, professional development and/or mentoring other teachers.

Nominees must submit:

A letter of application which includes evidence of the above criteria.

A Curriculum Vitae

At least two letters of reference, including one from an administrator and one from a professional colleague.
